CLUB COMPETITIONS

Throughout the season, there are club competitions when we play for a trophy. Some are played in one day, others over several days. Everyone is encouraged to participate, new and seasoned bowler.

Club competitions give us an idea of what happens in Interclub (V&D) events. In fact, going in competitions helps us to sharpen our skills and helps you to understand and enjoy bowling even more.

Remember, whether casual bowling or in competitions, it is important to enjoy yourself-that is when you do your best.

The dress code for all competitions is club colours/white tops and white or beige bottoms.

WHAT TO WEAR

Now that you have bowled for a month or so, perhaps you are still not sure of our club's dress code. Please use the following as a guide.

- ✚ Casual street clothes: wear for most activities
- ✚ Club colours/whites: This consists of club colours or white shirts and white or beige bottoms. Wear these for:
 1. Club days when playing for a trophy
 2. Visitations with other clubs
 3. Club competitions
 4. Interclub (V&D) competitions

Footwear: It is highly recommended that we wear street shoes to the club and change into dedicated, flat lawn bowling shoes. It is the fine gravel on soles of shoes that break down carpets. When going to other clubs with carpet, this is a must. This is also preferred when going to clubs with grass. Deep thread on grass can cause the grass to wear. When we install our new carpet, dedicated shoes will be expected. Please see the sign at the entrance to the club.



BEAUTIFYING OUR CLUBHOUSE

CHAMP DAY

On July 1, our club celebrate CHAMP Day.

A past member, Alan Russell, lost a leg during World War 11. After receiving an artificial limb, he became active in the War Amp organization, eventually becoming president of the Canadian branch. In 1975, with war amputees well served, the Veteran War Amps turned the Association's attention to child amputees by beginning the CHAMP program. The War amp Key Tag and Address Label Serviced financially support the CHAMP program.

Through JUMPSTART, a branch of CHAMP, children with multiple amputations receive funding for computers and assistive computer devices. CHAMP considers recreational limbs and devices to be a necessity for child amputees so they can keep active and take part in activities with their friends and families. The program covers 100 per cent of the cost of recreational limbs and devices, such as those designed for swimming, biking or playing a musical instrument. Members of CHAMP between the ages of 18 and 24 who are pursuing post-secondary education are eligible to become part of the CHAMP Development Program, with a focus on developing skills and knowledge that can set them out on the road to independence.

If you wish to make a personal donation to CHAMP, please put your cash or cheque in a sealed envelope with your name and address and place it in the designated container. If you are unable to attend bowling on July 1, please drop you donation off during the week.
